#### **KEY FACTS:**

- We need to raise £4.5m a year to continue our lifesaving service.
- This works out at over £12,000 a day.
- We receive no regular direct funding from the Government or National Lottery grants.
- We operate up to 19 hours a day, 365 days a year.
- We are one of 12 air ambulances who are able to fly at night.
- In 2023 we undertook 1,167 missions.
- In 2025, the charity will celebrate its 35th anniversary.

## Jamie's story

The incident, on 20 September 2022, took place along South Road in the Somerset seaside town. Jamie was perusing the menu on a restaurant window when a car left the road and mounted the pavement, careering into him. Mum Linda takes up the story.

She said: "Jamie's head hit the windscreen and he was subsequently flung over a six-foot wall, landing on a concrete driveway.

"Jamie was on holiday with his girlfriend Charlotte in Brean Sands at the time and she rang me quite soon after the incident happened. I struggled to understand as she was understandably hysterical.

"By then a local bar worker was giving Jamie CPR. She saw blood coming from his eyes, ears and nose, and continued to support him until the air ambulance landed."

As the nearest air ambulance resource available at the time, Wiltshire Air Ambulance was tasked to attend, taking a matter of minutes to fly from Bristol Airport where the crew had been undertaking pilot training.

The helicopter was flown by pilot Elvis Costello, with critical care doctor Reuben Cooper and critical care paramedic James Hubbard on board.

"We could see Jamie was really unwell with a head injury and was having a seizure as we arrived. The worry was he had sustained a significant brain injury, so we needed to stop that getting worse." said Dr Cooper

As a pre-hospital critical care doctor, Dr Cooper can carry out specialist procedures, as well as being able to prescribe a whole range of medication to support patients.

Dr Cooper added: "I gave Jamie a prehospital emergency anaesthetic to put him in an induced coma. That switches off the brain and lets it rest, which would stop any seizures and prevent further damage. We also took over his breathing by inserting a tube down into his lungs and putting him on a ventilator, as well as managing his blood pressure.

"We flew him to Southmead Hospital in Bristol, which is the regional major trauma centre."

Once at the hospital, Jamie underwent emergency craniotomy (brain) surgery and remained in an induced coma for two-and-a-half weeks.

He stayed in the critical care unit for four weeks before he was transferred closer to home in Coventry.

In November 2022 Jamie transferred to the Royal Leamington Spa Rehabilitation Hospital and was discharged two months later.

"Initially doctors couldn't tell us if Jamie would be able to walk or talk again because of his brain injury," mum Linda added. "However, he's made a fantastic recovery. His first word was Coventry, his favourite football team. That's when we knew he was back."

Jamie, who was aged 28 on the day of the incident, said: "I'm back living with mum and dad to get regular support and I've returned to work at the Dulux Decorator Centre twice a week. I was working full time before the accident and that's my long-term aim.

"I'm still receiving rehabilitation, including physiotherapy, speech and language therapy and neuro psychology.

"Most importantly, I'm able to go to football and support Coventry City!"

In March 2023 a group of Jamie's family and friends took on the Bath Half Marathon to raise funds for Wiltshire Air Ambulance.

Weeks later Linda and Jamie visited the Wiltshire Air Ambulance airbase in Semington, near Trowbridge, to re-engage with the aircrew who saved Jamie's life. They were joined by dad Nick, Jamie's girlfriend Charlotte and his sister Samantha.

"The Bath Half was a fantastic day," added Linda. "We had around 50 of us down there from Coventry, with about 25 of them running the half marathon.

"To meet the crew was unbelievable. We're just so grateful for everything they did for Jamie.

"We didn't know anything about air ambulances, the fact they aren't Government funded and they have to raise money as a charity to continue their work. It amazes us and we were only too happy to support them by fundraising."

Dr Cooper added: "To see Jamie some 14 months on and witness the incredible recovery he has made puts all the work we do into context."

To date 'Team Jamie' has raised over £10,000, which is the equivalent of paying for more than two lifesaving missions. Thank you!

## The power of online giving

Unsure where to start or how to set up your online giving page? Here are some stats from Just Giving for those fundraisers who have set up pages on their platform.



more sponsorship raised by pages set up 90-150 days before the event



more money raised via the JustGiving iOS app than desktop users



boost in fundraising by adding a personalised summary



more raised on average by uploading a profile photo to your page

#### The best fundraisers arrive early

Fundraisers who start early, about 90-150 days before an event, tend to raise 12% above their target. Plus, the earlier you start the more time you'll have to raise sponsorship, and you'll be able to update your supports as you go.

#### Add a profile photo

Fundraisers who add a profile picture raise on average 23% more. It helps friends and family searching for your page identify they have the right one. Plus, there's an excuse for selfie if we've ever heard one!

#### Don't forget your target

We may provide you with a fundraising target for an event, but did you know that fundraisers who add a target to their JustGiving page can lead to a 45% increase in the amount raised?

#### Make it personal

A personalised page summary tends to hit home to your supporters about why you're doing this. We can help you write a summary by supplying patient stories or facts about the charity. With a summary, fundraising can go up by 36%!

#### **Snap away**

Take photos of your training, whether you witness a great sunrise, running when the sun goes down or see something unusual. Those who update their page regularly have seen their fundraising go up by 8%!

#### Download the app!

Did you know, people spend 87% of their mobile internet time on apps, rather than browsers? Download the JustGiving app and make sure you turn on notifications to find out when your page receives a donation.

Talk to nearby businesses for potential sponsorship or prizes for raffles or auctions, tapping into their support can help bolster your overall fundraising efforts.

Connect with local newspapers and radio stations to expand the reach of your fundraising. Use their platforms to spread the word and gain wider community support.

Ask about match funding opportunities in your workplace to double the funds you raise. Check if your employer participates to maximise your fundraising potential.

Boost your fundraising by adding elements such as silent auctions, raffles, or food and drink sales. These touches can enhance donor engagement and contribute to your success.



We have lots of followers across social media, so anytime you post an update about your fundraising, remember to tag us.

If you're asking for sponsorship, tell people how you are feeling. Your friends and family will respond better if you tell them about your experiences. Spacing your messages out to one every fortnight is about right, though you may find it useful to increase the frequency in the week before the event to really galvanise people.

We can supply short videos, case studies and photos to help people understand why you – and we – need their support.

#### **Fundraising materials**

If you are creating your own posters, add a QR code so people can scan and be directed to your fundraising page.

#### **Choose Content:**

Have your fundraising page URL ready **Select a Generator:** 

Use an online QR code generator, such as gr-code-generator.com or QR Stuff.

#### **Enter Information:**

Input your fundraising page URL into the generator.

#### **Generate:**

Click "Generate" to create the QR code. **Download:** 

Save the generated QR code to your device.

Now, your QR code is ready for use! Place it where you want people to scan and access your fundraising page.

Please let us know if you would like any leaflets to ensure anything you produce complies about our work to hand out at your event. with Fundraising Regulations.

Please note, if you are creating promotional materials to support your fundraising or event, you **must** use the expression 'in aid of Wiltshire Air Ambulance'.

This is set out by the Fundraising Regulator to distinguish your fundraising from the charity's own fundraising.

If you produce any fundraising handouts yourself these must include the following:

#### **Special requests**

If you're hosting a large-scale event, such as a community fete, festival, or football tournament, you have the option to request a Wiltshire Air Ambulance merchandise stand to come along.

Our dedicated volunteers will be on hand, showcasing our merchandise and proudly representing the charity.

To add an extra touch of excitement, you can even request our beloved mascots, Wilber or Marsha, to make a special appearance.

It's important to note, this is subject to availability and must be requested in advance—so the earlier you make the request, the better!









#### **FAQs**

#### Do I need to tell you if I'm raising money for you?

If you're holding an event, please contact us on hello@wiltshireairambulance.co.uk or call on 01225 300536.

We can provide you with resources to help make your event a success!

#### Can you add my event to your website?

Yes, if you send over a copy of your poster and information about your event, we can put this on our events page.

#### Can I organise a fundraising event for Wiltshire Air Ambulance and another charity jointly?

Yes, as long as you let your supporters know how the money is being split, and between which charities.

#### Am I allowed to use your logo on posters/leaflets I've made to advertise my event?

If you are fundraising for us, you can use our 'in aid of' logo. It must be used within the guidance provided to comply with the Fundraising Regulator.

If you are unsure please contact us, we will be happy to help.

#### How do I organise a raffle?

All raffles fall under strict laws. There are some cases where a license from your local council may be required.

Please have a look at the Fundraising Regulator website and refer to the Gambling Commission's regulations.

#### How do I claim Gift Aid?

As a charity, we can claim an extra 25p for every £1 donated by individuals. Simply ask donors to fill in their name and address details on a sponsorship form or tick the box when making a donation using online platforms!



There are legal requirements for some fundraising methods such as raffles and street collections.

If you are planning fundraising events please let us know and we can give you all the relevant information.

Your safety is far more important than money, so whatever you do to raise funds, please don't put yourself at risk.

Above all, enjoy it – your enthusiasm will catch on! Don't forget, we're here if you need any advice, suggestions or support.



#### How your support helps

Items are for illustrative purposes; your donations will help us reach the £4.5 million we need each year to fund our service. Figures correct as of March 2023.

#### **Blizzard blanket**

An extra large thermal protection blanket which wraps around a casualty and seals with a selfadhesive closure to ensure they are kept warm.



£144

#### 20 packs of blood pressure cuffs

The cuff is wrapped around the patient's upper arm and inflated to stop the flow of blood in the artery in order to take a reading.



£972

#### Four units of Lyoplas

Lyoplas is freeze dried plasma in powder form. It contains the clotting agents needed to help blood to clot when a patient is bleeding.



£1,189

#### One pre-hospital blood transfusion

The aircrew can administer up to eight units of blood products to patients, which is the same quantity they would receive in a large hospital.



£4,000

#### One potentially lifesaving mission

We attend, on average, three missions a day. During 2023 we were called to 1,167 incidents across Wiltshire, Bath and surrounding areas.



£6,500

#### Replacement mannikins

Our Emergency Awareness Training programme delivers a range of lifesaving skills. Mannikins enable us to deliver hands-on CPR training to school-aged children across Wiltshire and Bath.



£12,329

#### Fund our service for a whole day

We need to raise £4.5 million a year, which equates to more than £12,000 a day. We are operational for up to 19 hours a day, 365
